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## 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The rally will be run in compliance with the International Sporting Code (and its appendices), the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, the 2020 FIA Middle East Rally Sporting Regulations, the National Sporting regulations which comply with the FIA Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins (issued by the organizer or the Stewards).

Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide, issued on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2020 on the event's website. The 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations can be found at the FIA Website, [www.fia.com](http://www.fia.com). For any dispute concerning the interpretation of the regulations, only the English text will be binding.

## 4. ENTRIES

### 4.1 Opening and Closing Date for Entries

Opening date: With the publication of these regulations

Closing date: Friday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2020, 12:00 hours (normal fee)

Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2020, 12:00 hours (late fee)

### 4.2 Entry Procedure

Anybody wishing to take part in The Cyprus Rally 2020 must send the entry form duly completed to the Rally Secretariat by Friday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2020 at 12:00 hours (normal fee) and by Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2020 at 12:00 hours (late fee) at the latest.

If the entry form is sent by fax, the original must reach the organiser at the latest five days after the close of the entries. On the entry form competitors must identify in which championship they want to score points.

Details concerning the co-driver can be sent up to **13<sup>th</sup> October 2020 at 20:00 hours.**

### 4.3 Number of Entrants accepted and classes

The maximum number of entrants in The Cyprus Rally 2020 is fixed at 60. In case there are more than 60 entries, the Organising Committee shall decide which entries will be accepted and notify the competitors not accepted by **6<sup>th</sup> October 2020**. The Organisers reserve the right to decide which drivers among the non-FIA priority/non-MERC drivers will be accepted and their decision is not protest able.

For participation of Rally cars, article 4 of the 2020 Regional Rally Sporting Regulations will be followed.

For competitors who will compete **to score points for the MERC championship** the following cars are also permitted:

- Cars included on the list "FIA Rally Touring Cars with extended eligibility"
- For MERC2 all cars which comply with the 2020 FIA App.J regulations for 4WD Group N cars, Group R4(VR4K) and Group R4 (VR4)
- For MERC3 all cars which comply with the 2020 FIA App.J regulations for 2WD cars of classes RC3, RC4, and RC5 and 2WD cars included on the list "FIA Rally Touring Cars with extended eligibility"
- For JUNIOR MERC CHAMPIONSHIP cars that comply with the 2020 FIA Appendix J regulations for RC3, RC4, RC5 class cars and 2WD cars that correspond with classes RC3, RC4 and RC5, and included on the "FIA Rally Touring Cars with extended eligibility" (Appendix 1).

#### 4.4.1 Additional Provisions

- Cars homologated as kit cars and Super 1600 are not allowed.
- For drivers entered with a Rally 2 car complying with 2020 Appendix j, Art.261, it will be possible to use the old part after applying a joker (except reliability and safety jokers).
- For drivers entered with a Super2000-Rally car complying with 2013 Appendix J Art.255A it will be possible to use lapsed errata without any penalty.
- An FIA technical passport is mandatory for S2000, Rally 2 and RGT cars.
- RGT cars in compliance with 2019 Appendix J, Art.256 must have a valid FIA RGT technical passport.

Private Entrant: Car entered by a member of the crew who competes under his/her own name or pseudonym.  
Legal Entrant: Car entered by a team or a company or other legal entity, holding a valid legal entrant's licence.

Private or Legal entrants not carrying the organiser's optional advertising must notify it on their entry form.

Vat (currently at 19%) **is not included** in the abovementioned entry fee.

4.6.2 The entry application will be accepted if accompanied by the total entry fees or by a receipt issued by the competitor's National Sporting Authority.

## 4.7 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full:

4.7.1. To candidates whose entry has not been accepted.

4.7.2. In case of the rally not taking place.

4.7.3. The organizer may refund 50% of the entry fee to those competitors who for reasons of "*force majeure*" (duly certified by their ASN), were unable to start in the rally. With the request of entry fee refund the competitor must send the organizer a certificate of "*force majeure*" given by his own ASN.

## 5. INSURANCE

The entry fees include the insurance which guarantees the competitors cover for civil liability of €30,000,000 for every event for Third Party personal injuries and up to €1,000,000 for every event for Third Party property damage, subject to excess of €200 for each and every claim.

Damages on Rally and/or Service Cars and injuries to their occupants as well as the liability of a crew member towards the other crew member of the car and/or towards the crews of other rally cars, are not covered by the organiser.

The insurance cover will come into effect from the start of the rally and will cease at the end of the rally or at the moment of retirement or disqualification.

## 6. ADVERTISING & IDENTIFICATION

### 6.1 Compulsory Advertising

Organiser's obligatory advertising is the name of the Rally.

### 6.2 Optional advertising proposed by organiser

Competitors who accept the organiser's optional advertising must reserve an area as shown in Appendix IV. Optional advertising will be announced in a bulletin.

### 6.3 Loss or removal of advertising

If it is ascertained at any point during the rally that an advertising plate (or any other type of advertisement) supplied by the organiser is missing from a car then the crew shall be penalised with a fine of €200 for each missing advertisement or if the advertisement is not placed according to the Appendix IV attached.

### 6.4 Competition numbers and rally plates

Competition numbers and rally plates according to Article 27 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, supplied by the organiser, must appear on both front doors of the cars during the whole rally. If it is ascertained at any time during the rally that:

- a competition number or one rally plate is missing, this will be penalised with **€150**.
- Both competition numbers or both rally plates are missing, this will be reported to the Stewards.

### 6.5 The first initial(s) and surname of both driver and the co-driver, followed by the national flags of the country of the ASN from which they have obtained their licences, must appear on the rear side window on both sides of the car, adjacent to the competition number. The name must be:

- In white Helvetica
- In upper case for the initial(s) and first letter of each name with the remainder in lower case.
- 6cm high and with a stroke width of 1.00cm.

The driver's name shall be the upper name on both sides of the car.

### 6.6 Advertising of tobacco, tobacco products and imitations, as well as smokers' requisites is forbidden by the Laws of the Republic of Cyprus, on cars, competition/service equipment and on the team members' outfits.

### 6.7 Car must be presented to scrutineering with the rally plates, competition numbers and optional advertising affixed.

## 7. TYRES

### 7.1 All the cars must be fitted with moulded tyres. Hand cutting or modification of the specified tread pattern is not permitted. Only marked tyres may be used on special stages.

### 7.2 Tyres for reconnaissance

In compliance with the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 35.2.b, free tyres for gravel are used for reconnaissance.

### 7.3 Treatment of Tyres

Any chemical and/or mechanical treatment of tyres is prohibited.

Any device for heating the tyres once fitted on the rim is prohibited.

Whether fitted on rims or not, keeping tyres in an artificially heated environment below 35c is allowed.



#### 7.4 Barcode Number

Each tyre must have either:

-Two identical moulded barcode numbers (one on each side of the tyre/ each barcode having a different colour as defined by the FIA) supplied by the 2020 FIA-approved barcode supplier, a specific or:

-A single moulded barcode number supplied by the 2020 FIA-approved barcode supplier

These barcodes will be used to check that the same tyres remain fitted to a particular car between tyre changes and that competitors are not exceeding the maximum quantities allowed. The tyre barcode must always be visible from outside the car.

#### 7.5 Tyre Quantities (this applies to ALL DRIVERS)

7.5.1. For all drivers entered in class RC2, a maximum of **18 tyres** may be used during the rally.

7.5.2 For all drivers entered in class RC3, RC4 and RC5, a maximum of **14 tyres** may be used during the rally.

7.6 In accordance with art. 13.13 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations all tyres used must be readily available commercially.

#### 7.7 Tyre marking procedure

A wheel/tyre marking/ barcode reading zone will be established at the exit of the Service park. For the sole purpose of assisting the tyre marking procedure, one team member for each crew may access the zone.

The crew has to stop its car and wait for the instructions of the scrutineers and/or marshal, in the absence of scrutineers or marshals, the crew may leave the zone without stopping.

For the Qualifying stage, the spare wheel will not be counted for the overall quantity of tyres.

7.8 Any breach of the tyre regulations will be submitted to the Stewards.

### 8. FUEL

8.1 Fuel must comply with FIA regulations article 252.9.1 and 252.9.2 of Appendix J.

Super unleaded 98 octane fuel is widely available in Cyprus.

**The competitors are responsible for checking the conformity of the event fuel each time they receive delivery, and before it is used in competition.**

8.2 All competitors should only refuel at the refuelling area at the exit of the Service Park and at the areas for Refuelling only which are indicated in the Road Book. In these areas, any kind of servicing is prohibited. Maximum two team members shall be allowed to refuel the car, but shall not be allowed to do any other work on the car.

8.3 The responsibility for refuelling is incumbent on the competitor alone

8.4 Engines must be switched off throughout the refuelling operation

8.5 It is recommended that the crew remain outside the car during refuelling, however, should they remain inside, their safety belts must be unfastened

8.6 The relevant personnel must be wearing clothing which will provide adequate protection against fire

### 9. RECONNAISSANCE

#### 9.1 Procedure for registration

9.1.1 Reconnaissance will be run in accordance with Article 35 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

9.1.2 Reconnaissance cars must be in conformity with Article 35.1 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

9.1.3 When registering for reconnaissance one of the crew members must be present to sign an indemnity and register the details of the reconnaissance car (spare recce car, if any), mobile telephone number and contact details of the place of residence.

9.1.4 The Reconnaissance Registration Form can be filled in during the Preliminary Documentation on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2020** at the Rally HQ.

## 9.2 Specific and/or national restrictions – speed limit

- a. It is emphasized that reconnaissance is not practice. The competitors must drive in a manner that does not endanger or cause inconvenience to traffic or people living near the stages. All road traffic laws of Cyprus must be strictly complied with and the safety of other road users must be respected.
- b. Reconnaissance is **PROHIBITED** from the publication of the rally supplementary regulations to the aforementioned dates. The presence of any entrant and/or crew member entered in the rally, on any part of a special stage, in any way whatsoever, is considered as reconnaissance and will be penalised. **Illegal reconnaissance will be penalised with a fine of €1000 payable at the secretariat before the event and reported to the stewards who may impose additional penalties.**
- c. Crews are required to present their reconnaissance timecard at the start and finish of all special stages. Crews will only be permitted to enter and leave special stages through the start and finish controls shown in the Road Books and may not, under any circumstances drive in a direction opposite to that of the Rally.
- d. The **maximum speed limit of 80 kph** (or as specified) is imposed on all special stages during reconnaissance unless the organizers introduce a lower speed limit.  
In compliance with Article 34.2.2 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, speeding during reconnaissance will incur a fine applied by the clerk of the course as follows:
  - **€ 25 per km per hour over the speed limit.**The amount of this fine will be unaltered by any fine imposed by the police. The fine will be doubled in case of a second offence committed during reconnaissance in the same rally.
- e. Reconnaissance is restricted to 2 passes in the same special stage.

## 9.3 Registration, Installation of Tracking and speed control devices

- 9.3.1 Registration for reconnaissance will take place as stated in the Rally Programme. At that time reconnaissance number plates, timecards and the schedules will be issued.
- 9.3.2 **All recce cars will be fitted with a monitoring system** of the speed and recce car position. A **deposit of €300,00** will be required. The Reconnaissance GPS tracking system must be used at all times during reconnaissance.

# 10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

## 10.1 Documents to be presented

The following will be checked at the administrative check:

- Drivers and co-drivers competition licence
- Valid Drivers and co-drivers driving licence
- Entry forms
- Entrants licence
- Authorisation from the crew's ASN to take part in the rally
- Information given on the entry form
- Insurance cover (third party) for the rally car
- Documents and registration papers for the rally car

## 10.2 Timetable:

The Administrative checks will take place on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2020** between **15:00-20:00 hours** at Rally H.Q according to a time schedule to be issued in a Bulletin.

**For the administrative checks, competitors may appoint a representative and/or a team manager (duly assigned in writing) for their entries.**

# 11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING & MARKING

## 11.1 Location

Scrutineering and marking will take place at Honda garage, Fedras Str No. 8, Kaimakli 1027, Nicosia (GPS N35.10.929 E33.23.429).

## 11.2 Times/schedule

From 14:30 to 19:30 hours on **Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2020**, according to a time schedule to be issued in a Bulletin.

## 11.3 Scrutineering provisions:

- Cars must be presented to the scrutineers with the competition numbers, rally plates and the optional advertising affixed on the car before entering the scrutineering venue.



- In compliance with Article 12.2 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, FIA technical passport is mandatory for S2000, and Rally2 cars.
- The crew must show the car's complete **original homologation** form as well as any appendices to this form. Any infringement will be reported to the Stewards.

#### 11.4 Windows:

The use of silvered or tinted film is authorised only on the rear windows. Front side window films must be transparent and clear (in accordance with Appendix J Article 253.11)

#### 11.5 Mud Flaps:

Transversal mud flaps are mandatory and must comply with Appendix J Article 252.7.7

#### 11.6 Noise:

For all cars the noise level on the open road must not exceed 103db(A)

#### 11.7 Tracking Devices

In compliance with Article 18.2 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations competing cars will be fitted with data logging and tracking devices that will give an accurate trace of the position, movement and status of all competing cars during special stages and liaison sections of the rally.

Any attempt to tamper with or to interfere with the data logging devices fitted to competing cars, or any device that fails to record a trace due to interference by the Crew will be reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty that may go as far as disqualification.

**All competing cars must follow the rally route as this is determined by the organizer and outlined in the Road Book. No deviation is allowed and no tolerance from the rally route is permitted.**

**Tracking devices for the Rally will be installed at the Starting Zone before the Ceremonial Start.**

Competitors are obliged to pay a deposit of €300 for the tracking units installed on their vehicle. This amount will be refunded to them upon returning the devices.

- 11.8 Drivers' safety equipment, including clothing, helmets, FHR device, etc intended to be used by each crew member, must be in compliance with FIA Appendix L – Chapter 111 and will be checked at the pre-event scrutineering. Extracts from FIA Appendix L can be found in Appendix V here after.

## 12. OTHER PROCEDURES

#### 12.1 Ceremonial Start

The ceremonial start will be on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> October 2020 on RIK Avenue outside the Service Park at 17:00 hours. Cars will be started at 1 (one) minute intervals in an ascending numerical order. **Route will be included in Road Book.**

All cars authorised to take the start with their crews must be driven to into the Starting Zone at any time between **16:00-16:45** hours on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> October 2020. **Route will be included in Road Book.** A penalty of €50 per 15-minute delay shall be imposed, to a maximum of 30 minutes. Cars arriving after a 30minutes delay will not be authorised to start.

#### 12.2 Official Time

Throughout the rally, the official time will be based on **GPS time signals.**

- 12.3 All cars will be started at **2 (two) minutes** intervals for all stages except the super special stage.

- 12.4 The starting order of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Leg will be determined according to Art.41.4 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations

#### 12.5 Timecard change during the rally

Timecards will be given/exchanged at the following time controls:

## 12.6 Starting system of special stages

Special stages commence from a standing start, with the car placed on the starting line. Any car not able to start from this point in the 20 seconds following a signal to do so is excluded and the car is immediately removed to a safe place.

A false start will be detected by manner of photocells placed ahead of the starting line.

The electronic start procedure shall be clearly visible to the crew from the start line and may be displayed as a countdown clock and/or a sequential light system. The electronic start procedure may be coupled to a device to detect and record if a car leaves the start line ahead of the correct signal (false start). The electronic start system will be described in a bulletin.

## 12.7 Early check-in at the end of Leg

**Crews are authorised to check in early without incurring penalty at TC6C Flexi Service OUT (end of Leg) and TC12D Holding Control (end of Rally)**

## 12.8 Restart on Leg 2 after retirement in Leg 1

### 12.8.1 General

Any crew which has failed to complete a Leg may be assumed to re-start the rally from the start of the next Leg, only unless they confirm otherwise **in writing** their intention to the Clerk of the Course. The competitor must advise the organiser in writing of the reason for retirement (e.g. accident, technical problems, etc) and the intention to have the car re-scrutineered. **This applies to ALL competitors.**

12.8.1.1 This shall apply to any car which has been not classified on the grounds of exceeding the time limit or has failed to report to a control, but shall not apply where the car has been excluded for breach of eligibility requirements, traffic infringements or by a decision of the Stewards.

### 12.8.2 Penalties

For all crews which re-start, a time penalty will be applied. This time penalty will be as follows:

12.8.2.1 For every stage or super special stage missed: 10 minutes.

12.8.2.2 This time penalty will be added to the fastest time of the driver's group for every missed stage, which shall include the special stage or super special stage on which the crew has retired.

12.8.2.3 Should retirement occur after the last special stage or super special stage before an overnight regroup, the crew will nonetheless be deemed to have missed that last special stage or super special stage.

### 12.8.3 Repairs and Scrutineering

#### 12.8.3.1 Service location and time allowed

Any car which fails to finish a Leg in accordance with the above may be repaired at the competitor's discretion. However, the car must report to the overnight regroup prior to the next Leg, no later than **1 hour before the scheduled start of the first car. This applies to ALL competitors.**

#### 12.8.3.2 Scrutineering of repaired cars

The car must retain its original body shell and engine block as marked at pre-event scrutineering. The competitor must be represented during this re-scrutineering at a time to be advised by the organisers.

## 12.9. Accident reporting

12.9.1 In the case of an accident where urgent medical attention is required, the following applies:

- When possible, the red "SOS" sign should immediately be displayed to the following cars and to any helicopter attempting to assist.
- As soon as possible, the red reflective triangle must be placed in a conspicuous position on the same side of the road as the car at least 50 metres before the car's position, in order to warn following drivers, even if the car is off the road.

12.9.2 Any crew which has the red "SOS" sign displayed to them, or which sees a car which has suffered an accident, and the OK sign is not shown, shall immediately and without exception stop to render assistance. All following cars shall also stop. The second car at the scene shall proceed to inform the next radio point. Subsequent cars shall leave a clear route for emergency vehicles. All crews stopped by this procedure will be allocated a time according to 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Art. 52.

12.9.3 In the case of an accident where immediate medical intervention is not required, or of a car stopping for any other reason on or beside a special stage, whether temporarily or permanently, the following applies:

- The green "OK" sign must immediately be displayed to the following cars and to any helicopter attempting to assist. If the crew leaves the vehicle, the "OK" sign must be displayed so that it is clearly visible to all other competitors.

- The red triangle must be placed in a conspicuous position on the same side of the road as the car by a member of the crew at least 50 metres before the car's position, in order to warn following drivers, even if the car is off the road.

**12.9.4 Should it not be possible, for whatever reason, to display the OK/SOS board in any of the above situations, this may be replaced by an evident and clearly understandable sign language shown by the crew outside of the car: - an arm and thumb up to indicate "OK" - crossed arms above the head to indicate "SOS".**

12.9.5 Any crew which is able but fails to comply with the above rules will be reported by the clerk of the course to the Stewards.

12.9.6 Any crew retiring from a rally must report such final retirement to the organisers as soon as possible, save in a case of force majeure. Any crew failing to comply will be subject to a penalty at the Stewards' discretion.

**12.9.7 INCIDENT ON A SPECIAL STAGE INVOLVING A PERSON WHO IS NOT A CREW MEMBER** If a crew is involved in an accident in which a member of the public sustains physical injury, the car must stop immediately, and the procedure as laid down in 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Article 53.3.1 must be followed.

12.9.8 The Red Flag will be displayed to crews only on the instruction of the clerk of the course. The flags may only be displayed at radio points marked in the road book and by a marshal wearing a distinctive jacket. Flags will be displayed at all radio points preceding the incident. A Red Flag will be available at each stage radio point (situated at approximately 5 km intervals). On passing a displayed Red Flag, the driver must immediately reduce speed, maintain this reduced speed until the end of the special stage, and follow the instructions of any marshals or intervention car drivers. Failure to comply with this rule will entail a penalty at the discretion of the Stewards.

12.9.9 A crew which has been shown the Red Flag will be given a notional time for the stage as in according 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations Art. 52.

12.9.10 If a stage is interrupted or stopped and the crews are required to pass through the special stage, a Red Flag must be displayed at the start to inform the drivers how they must proceed.

12.9.11 During reconnaissance, a sign bearing the radio post symbol will be displayed at the location of each radio point. This sign will be clearly visible to crews performing reconnaissance in order that the locations may be noted.

12.10 Flexi service at the end of Leg 1 is permitted as per Article 59 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

12.11 Special stage timing will be to 1/10<sup>th</sup> of a second.

**12.12 Excessive speed during the rally:**

In compliance with Article 34.2.2 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, speeding during the rally will incur a fine applied by the clerk of the course:

- **€ 25 per km per hour over the speed limit.**

The amount of this fine will be unaltered by any fine imposed by the police. The amount will be doubled in case of a second offence committed during reconnaissance in the same rally.

**12.13 Service Park**

There is one Service Park for the entire rally. The Service Park will be located at Lieutenant-General Evangelos Florakis Street (next to the Police HQ and the Police Road Safety Park).

GPS references of the **Service Park: N35 08.830 E033 22.594 (Service Out)**

The Service Park layout will be published in Rally Guide.



## 12.14 Super Special Stage

12.14.1 SS6 (Super Special Stage) will run on Sunday October 18<sup>th</sup> 2020.

12.14.2 All cars will be started at 3 (three) minute interval.

12.14.3 If retirement occur on Super Special Stage, the crew will nonetheless be deemed to have missed the super special stage, the penalty will be 10 minutes.

12.14.4 Gravel Tyres are obligatory for the Super Special stage.

12.15 The event will be conducted under the Mitigation plan issued by the Cyprus Automobile Association in September 2020.

## 13. IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS

The post chiefs and other officials will be identified as follows:

The **marshals** will be identified by **yellow tabards**.

The **Safety Marshals** will be identified by **orange tabards**.

The **Safety Officers** will be identified by **orange tabards with white stripe and text**.

The **Radio marshals** by **yellow tabards with blue mark**.

The **stage commanders** will be identified by **red tabards with text**.

The **Competitor Relations officer** by **red tabard**.

The **scrutineers** by **Black tabards**.

Other **officials** will be identified by **Special lapel name tags** showing their name and official capacity.

**Marshals' and Post Chiefs' uniforms will be displayed at the Secretariat.**

## 15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

- 15.1.** The Final Scrutineering will take place at the Honda Stelios Laos workshop in Aradippou, Aradippou Industrial Area, Larnaca, (GPS 34.57.886N, 33.35.090E), on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2020 at 17:00 hours.

Cars subject to final checks (decision of the Stewards) must have one representative of the entrant as well as mechanics (in case of dismantling) present at the final check.

**15.2. Protest Deposit Fees**

Sum of the protest Deposit set by the ASN: €1.000 (art.65.2 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations).

If the protest requires the dismantling and the reassembly of different parts of a car, the claimant must pay an additional deposit which will be specified by the Stewards as per art.65.3 of the 2020 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations.

15.2.1 The expenses incurred by the work and by the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if the claim is upheld.

15.2.2 If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (scrutineering, transport, etc) are higher than the deposit amount, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned to them.

**15.3.** Sum for an international appeal deposit (FIA): €3.000,00.

**15.4.** Sum of a national appeal deposit (ASN): €1.000,00.

### PRINCIPAL MISSIONS

Inform the competitors and play a mediating role at all times.

This post must be entrusted to an official in possession of a licence issued by their ASN as it implies certain knowledge of the general regulations. They may attend the meetings of the Stewards, in order to keep abreast of all the decisions taken.

The competitors' relations' officer must be able to be easily identified by the competitors. To this end it is advisable that:

1. They wear a very conspicuous badge or tabard.
2. They are introduced to the competitors at the drivers' briefing.
3. Their photograph be included in the Supplementary Regulations or in a bulletin if possible.

### PRESENCE DURING THE RALLY

When the secretariat is opened, they should have the secretary of the meeting draft a schedule of their duties which shall be posted on the notice board of the rally and which shall include:

- Presence at scrutineering
- At the secretariat of the meeting
- At the start of the rally
- At the regrouping halts
- Parc Ferme at the end of sections
- Near the Parc Ferme at the arrival (the latter being dependent on the rally timetable).

### Function:

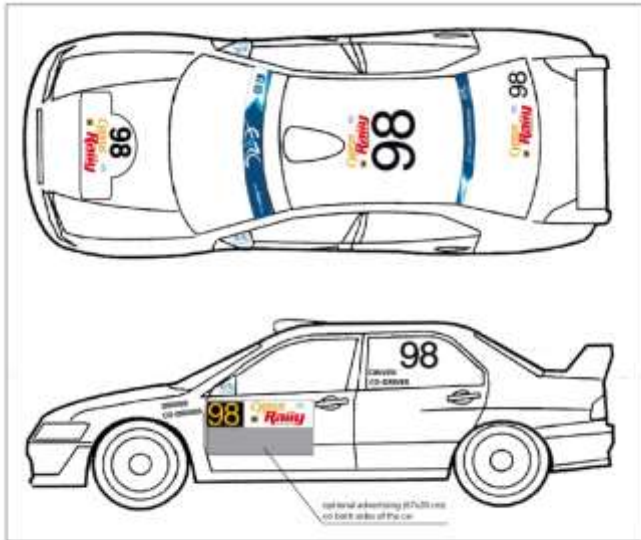
- Give accurate answers to all questions asked.
- Provide all information or additional clarifications in connection with the Supplementary regulations and the running of the rally.

### Mediation:

Avoid forwarding questions to the stewards that could be solved satisfactorily by a clear explanation with the exception of protests (for example, clarify disputes over times, with the assistance of the time-keepers).

The Competitor's Relations Officer shall refrain from saying anything or taking any action, which might give rise to protests.

**APPENDIX IV – COMPETITION NUMBERS AND ADVERTISING**



**Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements**

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III -Drivers' Equipment. These regulations apply also for Shakedown.

**Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)**

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8858-2002 or 8858-2010 (Technical List N°41),
- 8859-2015 (Technical List N°49),
- 8860-2004 or 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33)
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

Priority 1 drivers and their co-drivers must wear helmets according to the FIA standard 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP.

**Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)**

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858.

Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

**Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)**

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for codrivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74).

For Priority 1 drivers and their co-drivers, the wearing of equipment homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard is obligatory.

Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1

**Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)**

Drivers may wear a device to collect biometric data during racing.

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

**Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)**

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start.
